



TENURE TRACK FACULTY POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT LABOR MOVEMENT HISTORY AND LABOR LAW

The Labor Relations Institute (LRI), at the College of Social Sciences, University of Puerto Rico (UPR), Río Piedras Campus, is searching for outstanding scholars to fill a full time, tenure track Assistant Professor faculty position in the area of Labor Movement History and Labor Law, to begin in January 2017.

Requirements: Ph.D. degree in History with a specialization in Labor Movement History. It is desirable to have a Juris Doctor with evidenced professional experience in Labor Law. All degrees must have been earned from a recognized or an accredited university. Applicants must have completed research in Labor Movement History, with emphasis in at least one of the following contexts: Puerto Rican, Latin American, North American or European. Must have published articles in peer review journals, teaching experience at the university level, and demonstrated excellence in teaching. Must evidence the ability to work in an interdisciplinary and collaborative context. Must incorporate educational technologies and student assessment in the courses to be taught. Proficiency in Spanish and English. The candidates who qualify for the position will be required to give an academic lecture and to be available for interviews.

Responsibilities: Candidates must teach courses at the undergraduate program and at the Labor Education program of the LRI, during the day, evening and Saturday schedule. Must be available to supervise professional practices. Conduct research and have peer review publications in his/her areas of expertise; develop and submit proposals for external funding; contribute to departmental projects, as well as those at the College of Social Sciences and the Río Piedras Campus. Must fulfill all other obligations of a teaching position at the UPR. The responsibilities of the prospective candidate are included in the bylaws of the University of Puerto Rico.

The deadline for receiving documents will be September 30, 2016. Candidates must send: 1) a cover letter describing his/her academic philosophy, research vision and publication experience; 2) a curriculum vitae; 3) a copy of the academic credentials of all degrees earned by the candidate; 4) evidence of his/her research, publications and creative work; 5) three letters of recommendation to:
