**Call for Tenure Track Teaching Appointment in Guidance and Counseling**

The Department of Graduate Studies in the College of Education at the University of Puerto Rico, Río Piedras Campus, announces the search for a candidate in a tenure-track teaching position at the rank of Assistant Professor, to work in Orientation and Counseling with an appointment effective August 1, 2025.

**Requirements:** To be considered candidates must: (1) hold a doctorate (Ed.D. or Ph.D.) in Counseling in Education, Guidance and Counseling, preferably from a program accredited by CACREP; (2) have a current professional counselor license issued by the Board of Professional Counselors in Puerto Rico; (3) have a professional identity as a counselor with a minimum of two years professional experience in the field; (4) have experience and ability in academic research, creation, and teaching at the university level; (5) have experience in disseminating research through publications in peer-reviewed journals and presentations at professional conferences; (6) have experience in the use of technology for face-to-face and distance education; (7) be fluent in Spanish and English.

**Preferred qualifications:** (1) experience with the accreditation process of academic programs or institutions; (2) experience teaching at the graduate level, supervision of clinical practicum (Master's) and internship (Doctoral); (3) experience in directing or supervising research projects, theses, and/or dissertations; (4) participation as the primary resource in professional activities, such as workshops, for counselors. (5) Experience seeking external funding or participating in project proposals with external funding.

**Responsibilities:** Teach graduate-level courses related to counseling in educational contexts; conduct research in their area of specialization and disseminate it in professional venues; supervise theses and dissertations; provide academic advising; participate in department, faculty and institutional committees; teach primarily in the evenings and/or Saturdays using different modalities; actively participate in departmental and campus activities and projects; develop proposals seeking external funds.

**Required Documents:** (1) Updated curriculum vitae signed and dated on the final page; (2) Cover letter in which the candidate presents or explains: (a) professional plans for teaching and research, (b) research capability, (c) capability for both in-person and distance teaching, (d) experience teaching at the post-secondary level, particularly at the graduate level, (e) experience in supervising theses and dissertations; (3) Examples of their intellectual or creative contributions (up to three copies of recent publications in peer-reviewed journals or professional sources in PDF format); (4) Two recent letters of recommendation sent directly to [comite.personal.deg@upr.edu](mailto:comite.personal.deg@upr.edu);

(5) Evidence of their academic credentials and professional counseling license (submit digital copies of transcripts for all completed academic degrees, official copies will be required for finalists).
